POISONS (ADOPTION OF UNIFORM STANDARD) AMENDMENT ORDER 2025

I make the following order under section 14 of the *Poisons Act* 1971.

1. Short title

This order may be cited as the *Poisons (Adoption of Uniform Standard) Amendment Order 2025.*

2. Commencement

This order takes effect on the day on which its making is notified in the *Gazette*.

3. Principal Order

In this order, the *Poisons (Adoption of Uniform Standard) Order 2012** is referred to as the Principal Order.

4. Clause 4 substituted

Clause 4 of the Principal Order is revoked and the following clause is substituted:

4. Adoption of Uniform Standard

Schedules 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 of the Uniform Standard are adopted as the Poisons List for the purposes of the *Poisons Act 1971*.

5. Clause 5 amended (Interpretation of Poisons List)

Clause 5 of the Principal Order is amended as follows:

- (a) by inserting the following paragraph after paragraph (h) in subclause (1):
 - (ha) a substance included in the table in clause 3 of Appendix B to the Uniform Standard when used in an area, sub-area or sub-sub-area of use specified in that table in relation to the substance; or
- (b) by omitting from subclause (3) "Schedules" and substituting "Poisons List".
